In addition to preaching at the 11:00 o'clock and 7:15 worship services, Dr. McIntyre will be leading a special conference for church leadership and any members who wish to attend at the church training hour at 6:00 o'clock in the dining room.

SIMS TO SERVE AS INTERIM MINISTER OF MUSIC



Dr. W. Hines Sims, retired Secretary of the Church Music Department, Sunday School Board of the Southern Baptist Convention, will serve as our Interim Minister of Music.

A native of Louisiana, Dr. Sims holds the Bachelor of Arts and Doctor of Music degrees from Hardin-Simmons University, Abilene, Texas and the Bachelor of Music degree from Centenary College, Shreveport. He received a Master of Arts Degree and did additional graduate study in music education while serving a doctoral fellowship at George Peabody College, Nashville. He also has done graduate study at Southwestern Baptist Theological Seminary, at the University of Nebraska and at Northwestern University.

Before joining the Board's Church Music Department staff as Associate Secretary in 1946, Sims was Minister of Music for two years at Nashville's First Baptist Church. Earlier he was Minister of Music for 10 years at Queensborough Baptist Church in Shreveport. He also has served as music director and educator in churches and public schools in Arkansas, Nebraska and Louisiana. He became Secretary of the Church Music Department at the Sunday School Board in 1952 and served until his retirement in 1970.

He and Mrs. Sims now live in Shalimar. For the last 5 years he has served as Interim Minister of Music at the First Baptist Church in Crestview.

Dr. Sims will be working with the Adult, College, and High School Choirs. Mr. Joe Scott will be assisting with the administrative work of the total music program and giving staff leadership to the children's choirs.

We will welcome Dr. Sims as he comes to assist in this vital role.
