

## DR. BRIAN L. HARBOUR ACCEPTS CALL AS PASTOR

Dr. Brian L. Harbour was called to be pastor of our church in a special service last Wednesday evening, August 23.

Dr. Harbour is a native of Weslaco, Texas. He received his B.A. degree from Baylor University, Waco, Texas and earned the Ph.D. degree from Baylor with a major in religion.

In addition to student pastorates in Texas, he served as pastor of the Woodland Hills Baptist Church, Atlanta, Georgia; Colonial Heights Baptist Church, Jackson, Mississippi; and since 1975 has been pastor of the Shiloh Terrace Baptist Church, Dallas, Texas.

He has written numerous articles for denominational periodicals. His sermons have been printed in THE MINISTER'S MANUAL published by Harper & Row and a book of AWARD WINNING SERMONS published by Broadman Press. He writes a weekly column in the Mesquite Daily News.

At the morning worship service this past Sunday, T. A. Shell, Chairman of the Pulpit Committee, read to the congregation his official acceptance. He will be here to preach for the first time on Sunday, September 24.

Dr. Harbour and his lovely wife, Jan, have four children, Jay, age 7; Collin, age 5; Cara, age 3; Marty, age 1.

We look forward to the coming of this gifted man of God to serve as our pastor and to the opportunity of officially welcoming his family to our city and to the First Baptist Church. You will want to be much in prayer for him and his family.


