### "MISSIONS AT THE AIRPORT"

On Saturday, September 23, JAARS is holding a "Missions At The Airport" program at Coastal Airport.

JAARS (Jungle Aviation and Radio Service, Inc.) is the logistic support arm of the Wycliffe Bible Translators. They provide personnel and equipment in the form of special aircraft and shortwave radio stations to support Wycliffe personnel in remote jungle areas of the world.

The program on Saturday, September 23, will include illustrations of their aircraft, such as the STOL (short take off and landing) Helio Courier and the helicopter. They will also set up a shortwave radio station. Rides will be offered in the aircraft and every couple of hours there will be a demonstration of their special capabilities. Visitors will be able to speak with missionaries world wide through the radio station. There will also be a continuous showing of movies depicting their work in the jungle areas. Experienced JAARS personnel will be available to answer questions and relate personal experiences.

Activities will begin at 10:00 A.M. and will repeat themselves throughout the day until 5:00 P.M. Everything will be over by 8:00 P.M. Everything is free except for the aircraft rides which will be a penny a pound.

Coastal Airport is a grass field located on the South side of 9 Mile Road (Alternate Highway 90) exactly 3 miles West of the Interstate 10-Alternate Highway 90 exit.
