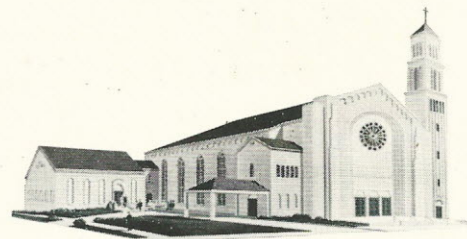

DR. RAY SUMMERS TO LEAD JANUARY BIBLE STUDY JANUARY 5-7

Our January Bible Study will be led this year by Dr. Ray Summers, Chairman of the Department of Religion at Baylor University. Dr. Summers, the author of many books and former teacher at both Southern and Southwestern Seminaries, is considered one of the foremost Baptist scholars alive today. He will be teaching the book of Mark. Study books are available through the church office at a cost of \$1.50 each.

The schedule for the January Bible Study will be as follows:

Friday, January 5

All adults and youth will meet in the sanctuary at 7:00 P.M. for the first session. Elementary children and preschool children will have special sessions prepared for them.

Dr. Summers will preach at both services on Sunday.

Brian's Lines

I think 1979 is going to be a great year. Our future as a church is as bright as the promises of God. In the Sunday evening worship service on January 14 I will give an introduction to the Gospel of John. The first few messages will be:

January 21, A.M.—"The Living Word", John 1:1-5, 10-14

January 21, P.M.—"A Man Called John", John 1:6-9, 15-37

January 28, P.M.—"The Dual Dynamic of Andrew", John 1:37-43

We will make it through John 10 by the end of May. It will be a rewarding walk through a great book. I hope you will be a regular part of the study.

THIS SUNDAY We will have the privilege of having with us one of the finest Baptist scholars in America, Dr. Ray Summers, teaching the book of Mark. I'll see you then for another exciting day.

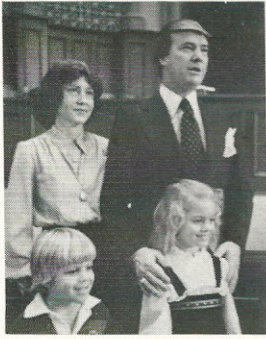
