

## Brian's Lines

I cannot begin to tell you the significance of the decision that our church reached on Sunday night. I believe that it is a key to the continued dynamic ministry of First Baptist Church. First Baptist Church is located at the heart of a great city. We have a history for creative, dynamic leadership in our city. We have always been a church that has been committed to the most effective ways of reaching people. And we have always been a

church which has responded to a challenge. All of these factors come into play in the decision that has been reached. Because we are the downtown church, we will have to use every avenue we have available to us to reach into the homes of people throughout the metropolitan area. Television is the most effective way of getting into the most homes. Even if we take the lowest figure, 5,000 homes a week, I cannot think of any way that we could reach into 5,000 homes every week other than by means of television. And we have the potential of reaching 20,000 homes or more.

There were some who questioned the value of such a ministry. I choose to take the word of those who are already involved in such a ministry. And their testimony is unanimous that a televised worship service does minister to people, that it does reach people, and that it does provide a service to the community that nothing else will do.

There are times in the life of a church when figures should be primary. But there are also times when faith should be primary. I believe that faith—faith in God, faith in the willingness of our people to respond to a challenge—is the platform from which we should and must launch into this ministry.

God has exciting things in store for First Baptist Church. Our new staff, our Businessmen's luncheon, and our television ministry are tools that God will use to help bring those exciting things about. OUR ACTEENS . . . ## CHURCH VOTES TO BEGIN TELEVISION MINISTRY

The church in conference, after a lengthy discussion, has decided to go ahead with the plans for a television ministry. 


