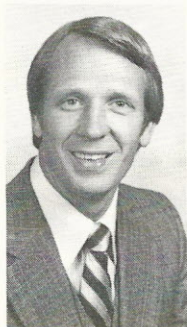

March 11—Sunday morning, the Baylor Chorale will participate in our worship service.

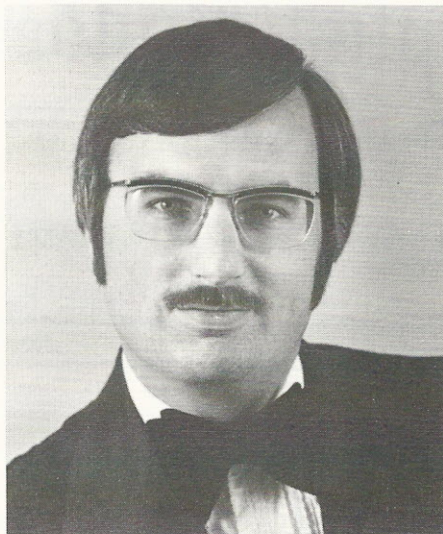

FURMAN CHOIR UPDATE



Dr. Bingham Vick, Jr.

Directing the Concert of the Furman Singers at our church on March 2, will be Dr. Bingham Vick, Jr. Dr. Vick, a native of Charlotte, North Carolina, has directed the Singers for the past eight years. He teaches voice and conducting in the college's outstanding music department. Vick also performs as a tenor soloist and guest conductor. He was the featured conductor last spring in Furman's production of Verdi's "Requiem."

Vick, a graduate of Stetson University, holds master and doctoral degrees from Northwestern University.

He is vice-president of the S. C. National Association of Teachers of Singing, a member of the Greenville Kiwanis Club and music director of Westminster Presbyterian Church in Greenville.

Before joining the Furman faculty, Vick was choral assistant at Northwestern, assistant conductor of the Chicago Symphony Chorus and taught and conducted at National College of Education in Evanston, Illinois.

He has studied conducting with Margaret Hillis, conductor of the Chicago Symphony Chorus and former director of choral activities at Northwestern, and Otto Werner Mueller, professor of conducting at Yale University. Vick's background also includes historical studies with Dr. John F. Ohl of Northwestern and analysis study with Julius Herford of the University of Indiana.

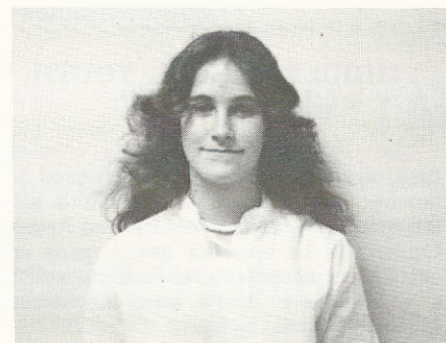
