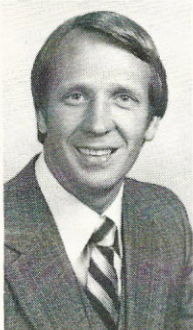

### THE TELEVISION MINISTRY . . . .

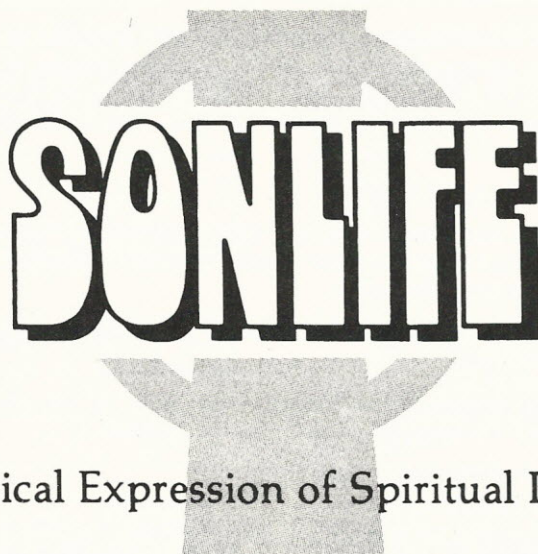
