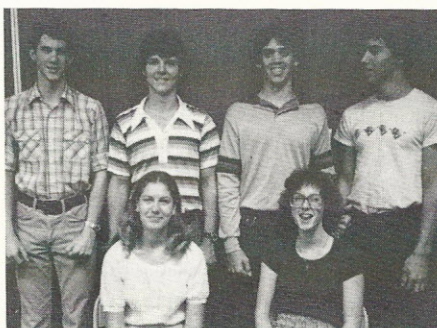

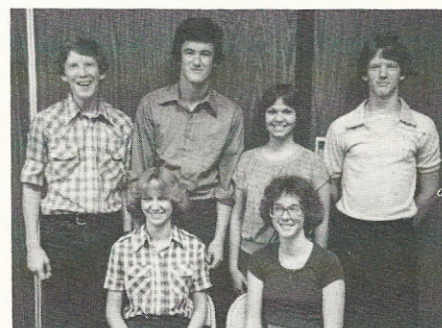

"LEISURE TIMERS" (Senior Adult Fellowship)

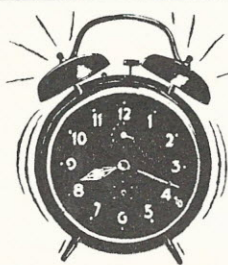
This Friday at 8:30 we will host the group from Park Cities Baptist Church, Dallas, Texas, for breakfast. I hope you plan to attend.

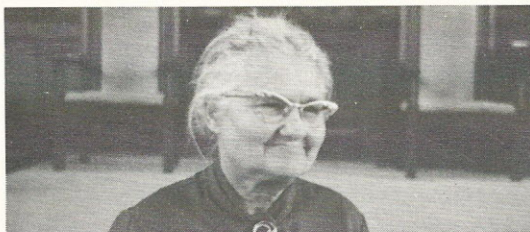

VIETNAMESE FAMILY NEEDS

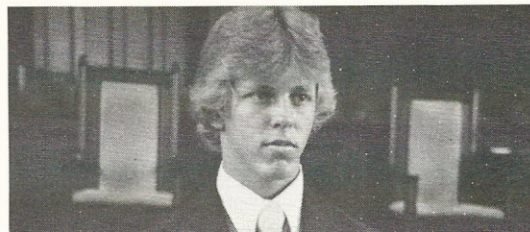
