Let me share with you some things that have been happening after my sermon on May 6, and as we lead up to the climax of our "Days of Grace and Days of Glory" this Sunday.



This last week one of our fine ladies came by the office with a check for \$1000. She said that she wanted to be a part of the dream that God had given for our church's future.

A couple came forward during the invitation and told me that they had been tithing for many years, but that they were going to give considerably more to the church this year so that we could get our new programs rolling.

I received a letter from a fine couple in our church who said they wanted to be more vitally involved in what was happening. Enclosed was a \$100 check from each of them.

The wife of one of our young couples came up during the invitation to say that she and her husband were going to make more of their resources available to God's work through the church.

A man who has been a member of our church for over 40 years came by my office this week. He said that he and his wife were giving all that they could give, but he wanted me to know that he was willing to do anything that he could do to be a part of the ministry of our church.

One of our newest couples told me Sunday that they were planning to be gone on May 20. But they had changed their flight schedule so they could be back on Saturday night and so they could be in Sunday School on May 20.

Danny Kepner, Chairman of the Missions Committee, told me that every need for our Vietnamese family had been supplied by our people.

Last night we baptized fourteen people who have recently made decisions.

I'm excited, and I don't mind telling you. God is up to something in our midst. And I am thankful that He is letting us be a part of it.
