Summer is here! We are moving into what I think can be our most rewarding months in terms of fellowship, Bible Study, and outreach. Hundreds of new people will be moving into our city during the next three months. What a tremendous opportunity to reach them for our church. Be on the watch for moving vans in your neighborhood. . . . Give whatever assistance you can to your new neighbors, invite them to come to church with you. Let's make this truly a summer for the Savior at First Baptist Church.

FAITHFULNESS . . . I am continually amazed at the faithfulness of so many of our people to our Bible Teaching ministry. Mr. Blackmon told me of a man who attends one of the classes in Adult 7. The man is not a member of our church, but for the last sixteen years he has been attending our Sunday School. He lives eighteen miles on the other side of Milton. Yet, during the last sixteen years he has only missed Sunday School three times! That is the kind of faithfulness out of which God will build a great Sunday School.

INVITATION . . . The ushers have informed me of a problem that needs to be spoken to. The most holy moment in every worship service is the invitation time when God deals with the hearts of those who need to make decisions. But a large number of people exit during that time and cause a real disturbance to those sitting around them. Now, I realize that there are some who need to leave because they cannot be in the large crowd that leaves at the regular time. But there are many who are leaving simply for the matter of convenience. Let me ask you to just do this. Consider if it is more important for you to leave, or if it is more important for God to have an opportunity to speak to those who are around you. Let's work at making the invitation time like the rest of the service, an opportunity to respond to God's love.
