### PRIORITY NO. 1—REACHING PEOPLE (Last in a Series)

Recent articles have focused in on departmental officers and how they relate to outreach. The actual contact of prospective members occurs through Sunday School Classes, however, and we must mention those leaders and their duties.

Everything that occurs in the class is the ultimate responsibility of the teacher. He should keep class outreach offices filled and give priority to the matter of reaching people. The class should be divided into groups with leaders elected to be responsible for each. The group leader is responsible to the class outreach leader for maintaining contact with all the members of the group. The class outreach leader is then responsible to the teacher for maintaining week-by-week visitation of prospects and members. He should also have the class outreach book in the class on Sunday morning and make assignments of prospects to all members.

Outreach is the subject, reaching people for Christ, the object. It is everyone's responsibility.

## "PUT A FEATHER IN YOUR CAP" READING CLUB

July 1 thru July 29  
GRADES 1 - 6

A reading club conducted by our Church Library will begin July 1 and continue through Sunday, July 29.

Club requirements for grades 1 - 5 will be six books from the younger children's section of the Church Library.

Club requirements for grades 4 - 6 will be 2 non-fiction, 1 biography, and 3 fiction books from the older children's section.

All books must be checked out from the Church Library and must be turned in on or before July 29.

A card, available in the library, must be filled out and turned in for each book read when the book is returned to the library.

When a reader completes a book and turns in his card, a feather will be placed on his hat on the chart in the library.

A reader can earn additional feathers in his cap if he enlists a parent to read a book from the Adult Section of the Church Library. This is limited to five additional feathers.


Each person who completes the required 6 books will be awarded a certificate. As special recognition for the person in each group who reads the most books, a book will be placed in the library in his honor.





These suggestions must reach the committee by Wednesday, July 11, 1979. They may be given to any member of the committee, mailed to the church office in care of the committee, or dropped into the offering plate.

## **PROCEDURE FOR NOMINATING DEACONS**

The committee for the Nomination of Deacons requests that every member of the church suggest men who should be considered by the committee for nomination as deacons. You may suggest as many as you think qualify.

These suggestions must reach the committee before Wednesday, July 11. They may be given to any member of the committee, mailed to the church office in care of the committee or dropped in the offering plate. Suggestions are to be submitted only by members of the First Baptist Church, and therefore must be signed to be accepted.

Your committee, selected for the purpose of recommending to the church the best qualified persons, requests that you read the Scripture passages below and suggest the names of as many men as you believe to be qualified to serve as deacons. According to the policy of the church, inactive deacons will not be placed on the ballot unless suggested by one or more members of the church.

### **SELECTION OF FIRST DEACONS**

"And in those days, when the number of the disciples was multiplied, there arose a murmuring of the Grecians against the Hebrews, because their widows were neglected in the daily ministrations. Then the twelve called the multitude of the disciples unto them, and said, 'It is not reason that we should leave the word of God, and serve tables. Wherefore, brethren, look ye out among you seven men of honest report, full of the Holy Ghost and wisdom, whom we may appoint over this business. But we will give ourselves continually to prayer, and to the ministry of the word.' " Acts 6:1-4, KJV.

### **THE CHARACTER AND QUALIFICATIONS OF ALL DEACONS**

"Likewise must the deacons be grave, not double-tongued, not given to much wine, not greedy of filthy lucre; Holding the mystery of the faith in a pure conscience. And let these also first be proved; then let them use the office of a deacon, being found blameless. Even so must their wives be grave, not slanderers, sober, faithful in all things. Let the deacons be the husbands of one wife, ruling their children and their own houses well. For they that have used the office of a deacon well purchase to themselves a good degree, and great boldness in the faith which is in Christ Jesus." (I Timothy 3:8-13 KJV).

We urge you to be much in prayer that we as a church may know God's will in this all-important task.

The vote by the church membership on the nominations recommended by the committee will be on Sunday morning, September 2, 1979.
