In France they tell the story of the little village that held its annual Harvest Festival. As each family began to gather its part of the food and drink, the villagers decided to make the filling of the wine barrel a co-operative effort. Each family would bring its own wine, the wine they had made themselves, and pour it into the community barrel.



At the climax of the celebration the mayor opened the barrel and began a round of toasts. But when he tasted the first glass he discovered that instead of wine it was only water. Each villager had brought water and saved his own wine at home for they were sure that in so large a barrel a little water would never be noticed.

Have you ever thought that your little contribution was not important, that it really didn't matter what you did? If so, stop a minute and think.

Think of what God has done with "little" things. He used a scraggly bush out in the desert to speak to Moses. He used a little boy with a lunch to feed thousands. 
