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

Did you know that at the heart of every strong, dynamic, growing church is a vibrant Sunday School? That's right. Because the Sunday School is the hub from which all of the important emphases of a church evolve Fellowship, Bible Study, ministry, evangelism, financial support — all of these must be rooted in the Sunday School. That is why we are committing this year as a year of Sunday School growth. That's why I am going to begin teaching the Sanctuary class in October. That's why we are encouraging you to try Sunday School. Even without the nearly 200 that we used to bring in on the busses, our attendance Sunday was near 1250. What a foundation to build on for the new Sunday School year.

HARVEST . . . What is it? It is a month for spiritual renewal. It will begin with Advancement Day on October 7. It will climax with Great Day in the Morning on October 28. In between will be efforts to reach our community with the message of Christ featuring three great nights of revival. October could be our greatest month. Let's pray to that end. Let's expect it to happen. Then, let's do what we can to make it happen. I like the way someone once said it. "I pray as if everything depended on God. Then I work as if everything depended on me." The result of that kind of approach will be a fantastic harvest in October.

Make a special effort in your Sunday School classes, in your departments, and in the worship service to extend a warm welcome to our visitors. Talk to them. Find out about them. Tell them about what is happening at the church. Make them feel welcome. We're doing a good job at this, so let's keep it up.

Harry Piland Urges Greater Emphasis on Adults

(This article is from a press release by the Sunday School Board of the Southern Baptist Convention. In the light of more adult participation in the Sunday School, we urge the congregation to read this word from Harry Piland, director of the Sunday School Department of the Sunday School Board.)

Building a strong Sunday School requires an emphasis on reaching and teaching adults, according to Harry Piland, director of the Sunday School Board's Sunday School Department.

Piland is quick to add his belief that giving attention to adults through the Sunday School will strengthen rather than weaken ministries with other age groups.

He cited the numbers of adults and the fact that they provide the leadership and financial base in churches among his reasons for giving priority to adult Sunday School work.

When adults are reached they bring their preschoolers, children and youth with them. "When adults grow, all areas grow," he said.

He noted that during a three-year period at First Baptist Church, Houston, Texas, the average attendance of pre-schoolers grew from 325 to 700. During the same period, attendance of adults doubled — from 1000 to 2000.

Piland served as minister of education at the Houston church for five years prior to assuming leadership of Southern Baptist Sunday School work in 1978.

Numerically, adults comprise 68.1 per cent of the population in the United States today. In Sunday School enrollment, Piland said adults make up 50 per cent of the congregation in most churches and up to 80 per cent of the prospects.

"The sheer weight of the numbers of adults demands our attention," Piland said. "If we neglect this area, we neglect the major segment of the population."

Piland also noted that while "adults give most of the money and pay the bills, they should be reached because they are important as individuals. The time remaining to reach them is less and less with every passing year."

"Church ministries with preschoolers, youth and adults could not exist without sufficient numbers of trained adults to work with them," Piland said. "Without adults, classes would go without teachers and the church would lose its ability to penetrate its community with mature, capable and aggressive leadership."

To give adequate attention to Sunday School work, Piland listed six needed actions. *First*, he said, leaders with adults must be committed and trained. *Second*, he urged strong emphasis on weekly workers meetings, which have great potential "for training, fellowship, planning, preparation and prayer."

Piland said churches should provide adequate space and equipment for adult Sunday School classes and departments, plan socials, retreats and conferences for them and provide funds to send some adult workers to Glorieta and Ridgecrest for training.

Finally, he advocated leading adults to minister to one another. "When class members study and discuss his word, pray together and have fun together, they come to know each other," Piland said. "The potential for loving counsel and real concern in an adult class is unlimited."


