Brian's Lines

I was overwhelmed Sunday morning by your response and your expression of appreciation for our first year together. It has been a good year for us. You have been warm in your acceptance and kind in your support. I'm looking forward to our second year as Pastor and People and am praying that God will indeed make it a year of advance.



PREACHING SCHEDULE . . . We finished the Gospel of John! For a year we have been walking through what I believe to be the richest of the Gospels. My prayer is that it has enriched our understanding of the Master. Now we are getting ready to launch into the book of Acts. These sermons on Acts will begin in November. Remember, I have asked you to read the book through twice before the sermon series starts. Many of you have already called into the office to inform us that you have completed the assignment. There is a poster on the bulletin board by the dining hall where you can also sign up. Your preparation will enhance your understanding of these sermons on Acts. These will be exciting days as we look at the story of the early church.

OCTOBER PREACHING SCHEDULE . . . This month will be an interlude between John and Acts. On Sunday mornings I will be preaching on the subject of evangelism. "Evangelism: Our Mandate," "Evangelism: Our Motivation," "Evangelism: Our Method," and "Evangelism: Our Message" will be the four messages. This is a part of our Harvest theme as we focus on the purpose of the church. On October Sunday nights, I will be preaching on four of the Psalms. Psalms 1, 23, 51, and 73 will be the ones I will deal with. Continue to pray for me in this most vital part of my responsibility.

REVIVAL . . . The month of October will hinge on the three Harvest Revival Nights, October 10, 17, and 24. Each service will begin at 6:30 following our regular Wednesday night meal. Bring a friend with you to supper, and then for church. This is a tremendous opportunity to bring those to church who need God's hand upon their lives. This is a great time for

SAMFORD HIGH SCHOOL DAY

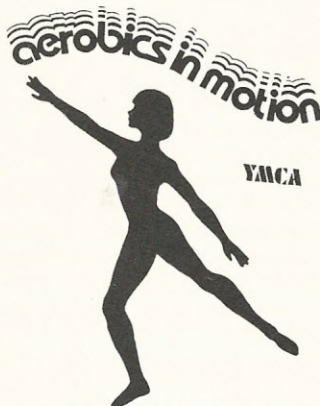
