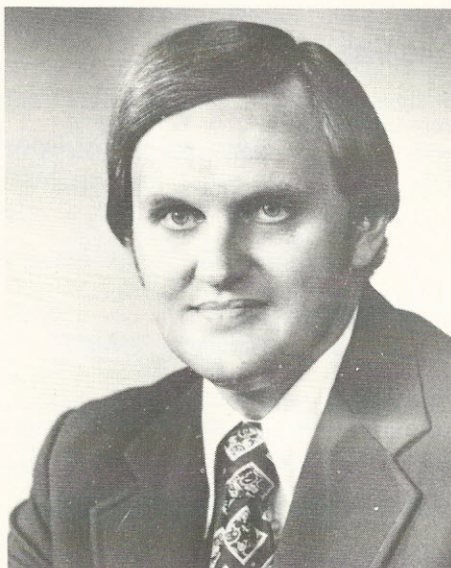
YEAR OF THE SUNDAY SCHOOL . . .

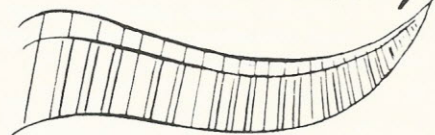
1978-79 CHURCH YEAR

"School! School! School! What's it worth? Why do we have to spend so much time memorizing, studying, working? Why can't we just skip school? I hate it!"

Does that sound familiar? Have you ever felt that way about school?

Well, let's take some time to think about school. Why school? Of course, there is the obvious reason that school is the time you spend in preparation for the rest of your life. After all, is twelve years too long to spend preparing for the other fifty-eight years?
