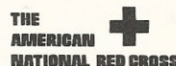


BIRTHDAYS

BUDGET UPDATE

In order to meet our 1979 budget of \$850,000, we must have budget receipts each week of \$16,315. Through September we needed to receive \$636,302 to be on target for the budget. We have received \$591,161 which means that we are \$45,019 short through three quarters.

The months of October, November, and December need to be big months financially as we seek to fulfill our obligations for programming and missions for the year.

As we go into the last quarter of the year, it would be a good time to evaluate your giving patterns. Are you following the Biblical pattern of systematic, proportionate, cheerful, sacrificial giving? If not, begin this week. It's not too late to become a part of what God is doing in First Baptist Church.

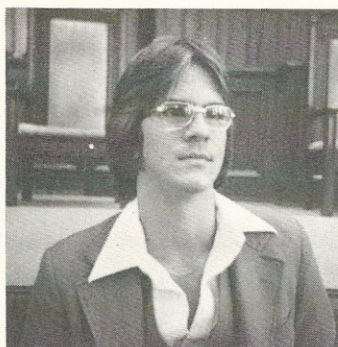
