The "Massing of the Colors" service on Sunday night was outstanding. How grateful we are to have in our membership so many who are actively involved in the military. And what a fitting time to have this patriotic



service in which we were reminded of all those who have gone before. We as Americans are today building on the foundations they have laid. The same thing is true of our church. We stand on a firm foundation. What a rich heritage we have.
