A New Hymnal

Many persons in our church have asked me about the possibilities of our securing the new BAPTIST HYMNAL. I am excited over the prospect of our securing this new worship tool. The two resources that we use most frequently in worship are the Bible and our hymnal. Many of our present hymnals are becoming weary looking from use—in other words, the bindings are wearing out.

The paper used in the new hymnal is manufactured by the largest manufacturer of lightweight directory and Bible paper in the world. This is the finest source available in terms of quality of product, longevity and reputation. This company manufactures over 50 percent of all the lightweight paper in the United States. Some characteristics of this paper are: Minimum show through of ink, clarity of printed image, brightness for easier reading, designed for extra strength and longevity, quietness in use, lighter for ease of handling.

There are a variety of hymns included in the new BAPTIST HYMNAL. There are nine chorale tunes of the Lutheran Tradition, three Swedish hymns, five Welsh tunes, and four Irish tunes. Tunes from other countries are included with American Hymns. Many of the texts are expressive of God's work in our midst and our response to Him. Of the five songs sung by our choirs yesterday, four were from BAPTIST HYMNAL. I am looking forward to provisions being made for our securing the new hymnals.
