had lived a long life, and his Sunday School Class did a tremendous job in standing by his wife. Then on Thursday we shared in the grief with Hong and Su Dang following the fire which destroyed their home and took their baby. Already, you have

provided most of what they will need to set themselves up in a new home. Your response has been tremendous. Then Friday, as we stood by Joy in her time of hurt, those of you who have become her friends helped minister to her in ways that you will never completely know. When Jesus washed the feet of his disciples in John 13 He was giving a lesson to the church: greatness comes in service. The greatness in our church this week was shown not in our outstanding attendance on Sunday, not in the new members who joined, not in our beautiful music at the worship services, but in the fact that we dared to serve in Jesus' name. God bless you.
