I hereby accept that invitation, believing it to be God's plan for my life at this time.



CHURCH CONFERENCE REPORT

In the monthly business conference at First Baptist Church, several items of business were acted on.

1. The requests for letters were granted. With the new members who had joined during the month, the total membership of First Baptist Church has now gone above the 4,000 mark. We have 4,020 members.
2. Our financial report was approved which showed we received \$806,455.40 in budget gifts during 1979.
3. An account was established to purchase the new Baptist Hymnal for our church. Money given to this account will be earmarked for that purpose. When the amount needed to buy 1200 books has been given, the purchase will be made.
4. The church approved the recommendation of the Deacons to send two individuals to Korea this summer as a part of the nation-wide crusade sponsored by Florida Baptists. One of these will be Pat Ford. In addition, Dr. Clevenger is sending two others so four from our church will be going. A fund has been established for this purpose.

Youth And — self-esteem

"I'm just not worth anything. I think I'll go jump off a bridge. No one really wants me. I can't do anything right."

"I would have to admit that I can do better than most people. Well, she's just jealous of me. I'm really smarter than most of the people in my class."

Do these statements sound familiar? Do you use them often? They're common ones for young people. They express how young people feel about themselves from time to time.

Such statements are reflective of your self-esteem — that is, your own feeling of worth. In using one of the first statements, you express a low self-esteem and when you used one of the latter statements, it expresses a high self-esteem.

We need to develop healthy, balanced self-esteem. That is, we need to consider ourselves important but not more important than we are. A self-esteem that is either too high or too low is unhealthy.

Where does your self-esteem come from? Well, it is developed by your relationship with other people. Most important are your parents, your peers (those your own age), and your leaders and teachers. If they support you and encourage you then you are likely to have a good self-esteem.

Often young people feel left out, rejected, worthless, and unwanted. That feeling hurts because we all need to be wanted.

When you feel like that remember that in God's eyes each of us is important—the fisherman, tax collectors, the plain ordinary folks. In John 15:13, Jesus said, "As the Father has loved me so have I loved you." If you're important to God then it doesn't matter so much what others think. God loves you and has a plan for you. You're important to Him.

On the other hand, some young people feel that they're just a little better than the average. But in God's eyes, no one is anymore important than anyone else. You may be more attractive or more talented, but those are gifts given to you to be used for God. And furthermore, as Paul said in Philippians 2:3, "In lowliness of mind let each one esteem the other as better than himself." That is, we ought to consider others first. So don't feel too important because we all belong to God.

Each of us needs to work on developing a healthy self-esteem. Think about it this week. You're important to God — we all are.
