
It was a cold Sunday, but a good one. I am thankful for the fine workers and teachers who give their time and effort to our Sunday School. Keep up the good work.

IDEAS FOR FAMILY NIGHTS AT HOME

Dinner:

Before dinner, secretly place a Bible question, or riddle under each plate. During the meal ask the family member to look under their plate and answer the question or riddle. It should stimulate some interesting conversation.

Activities:

A family relay with your children will prove to be a fun time for all. Here are a few suggestions: (1) Forehead Race — with a partner, carry a balloon between foreheads to the goal and back, (2) Clothespin Relay — with clothespins placed on a clothes line, have family members run to the line, remove a clothespin with your teeth and drop it into a small bottle or glass at the starting line, (3) Balloon Broom Relay — Players "sweep" a round balloon from the start line to the goal line and then carry the balloon back to start or the end of the broom.

Devotion:

Read PHIL 2:4, "Don't just think about your own affairs, but be interested in others too, and in what they are doing." — *Living Bible*

Bedtime:

Insights from the day's activities can be gained if you will ask your child one of these questions when you say "good night." 1. What did God teach you today? 2. How did you show His love today? 3. If you could live today over again, what would you change? Remember to pray for specific circumstances in your child's life or in the life of others.


