"OPERATION CARE" is the theme for our Youth Summer Mission to Lancaster, Pennsylvania, July 19 - 26.

Good Morning First Baptist Church, Pensacola! If you should decide to accept this mission there are some things you should know. Lancaster County is known as "*The Quiet in the Land County*." This refers to the Amish people. The countryside is beautiful and holds many opportunities for sightseeing.

MANY RELIGIOUS PEOPLE — One would think, by having so many religious people in one town, that there would be few unsaved people and no need for a mission.

THE MISSION — Yes, there are many religious people in Lancaster, but there are thousands who have never experienced the life-saving testimony that your young people can give.

GREAT ODDS — The two Baptist Churches in Lancaster and nearby New Holland are up against great odds. They need to conduct church surveys but they don't have enough help. They want to penetrate the Long Park area with Backyard Bible Study, but they lack the manpower.

SPECIFIC MISSION — Your mission, should you accept it, will be to conduct the church survey and Backyard Bible Study with your youth.

ADULTS NEEDED — You must train the few adults of the New Holland Church to carry on when you leave. Your adults will conduct training seminars in teaching Sunday School, Visitation, Music, and enjoy actual Christian fellowship with your adults.

THE ENEMY — Your enemy is that shady villain, *Mike Misunderstanding Magoo*. Mike has slain several mission groups like yours as they attempted to reach the people of Lancaster. He has convinced many of the Lancaster people that the Baptist are irreverent and undisciplined people. Your group will need to change this misunderstanding and introduce these people to the Joy and Freshness of being a "Youth For Christ."

CHURCH SUPPORT — Your mission will need the full support of your church. Their mission, should they accept it, will be to pray daily for:

1. The two churches.
2. That the enemy *Mike Misunderstanding* will be defeated.
3. That the adults in the New Holland church will be receptive to the training of our adult team.
4. And for the two missionaries in New Holland.

BUSINESS CONFERENCE REPORT

MAY 21, 1980

The church met in regular conference on
Wednesday night, May 21. Dr. Bob Wilson
presided over the meeting.

1. Bob Hinson, Church Treasurer, gave the financial report which showed total budget gifts of \$278,361.36 for the first four months. He reported that we were close to budget requirements and urged the people to continue to be faithful in their giving.
2. He announced the receipt of \$5,500 from Mrs. E. F. Dunbar of Troy, Alabama, which is to establish a fund in memory of Mrs. Dolly McGowin. The interest from the fund is to be used for youth ministries in the church.
3. Dr. Wilson gave a progress report on two special committees: the committee to investigate the needs of our church in terms of estate planning and wills and the committee for the future.
4. Those requesting letters were granted and the additions to the church were acknowledged, leaving a total of 4031 members at First Baptist Church.

LEISURE TIMERS ELECT OFFICERS


