

BUSINESS CONFERENCE
REPORT

On Wednesday night, June 18, the church met in its regular monthly conference with the following items covered.

1. The financial report was presented showing budget receipts at the end of five months to be \$342,548. Bob Hinson encouraged our people to continue their fine pattern of giving this year.
2. A Television Ministry fund was established which would include the \$7,400 already given for the television ministry and would hold any other funds given for that purpose.
3. Dr. Bob Wilson announced that the articles of incorporation were going to be amended to make possible the establishment of a First Baptist Foundation to receive special gifts and gifts that come to the church through wills and trusts.
4. On the recommendation of the Transportation Committee and the Finance Committee, the church voted to purchase another van.
5. A recommendation from the kitchen committee to increase the prices for Wednesday night supper tickets to 50 cents for preschoolers, \$1.00 for children, \$1.50 for adults, and \$1.75 for takeouts was approved by the church. This will go into effect on the first Wednesday night in August.
6. The church voted to provide financial assistance to the Woodlawn Baptist Church, a sister church in our association, for the next six months.
7. The church voted to license Allen Edmisten to the Gospel ministry. This would be acknowledged in a worship service in the future.
8. The requested letters from those who had joined other churches were granted. The total membership of First Baptist Church is now 4,043.
