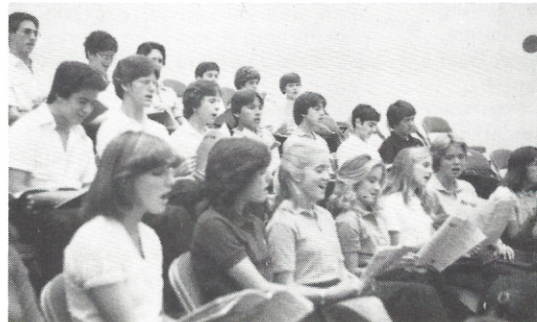


FIRST BAPTIST, THE WEDNESDAY NIGHT PLACE TO BE . . . I don't know if you realize it or not, but we have one of the most outstanding Wednesday night programs anywhere. Since the beginning of our Fall program, we have averaged feeding 575 every Wednesday night. Last Wednesday night we had 600. For an informal time of sharing with other members of the family of faith here at First Baptist, there is just nothing like Wednesday night. Following the supper I lead in a Bible study around the tables in the dining hall. Why don't you join with us this week.

SUNDAY SCHOOL IS TOUCHING LIVES . . . Our Sunday School is on the grow. Last September we averaged 1150 each week. This September we averaged 1268 each week. Even more important than the numbers is the ministry that is being done. I received a letter this week from a parent of one of our young people.
