**CHANGE OF TITLE . . .** Since Jerry Spivey came as our Minister of Adults nearly two years ago, he has coordinated the overall education ministry in addition to doing his excellent job with all phases of our adult work. To bring his job title and description in line with what he is actually doing, the Personnel Committee recommended to the church, and the church unanimously approved, that we change Jerry's title from Minister of Adults to Minister of Education at First Baptist Church. A spirit of victory is already sensed by the members of First Baptist Church, Pensacola, Florida, as we look forward to a great evening of fellowship, meal, and service at 6:00 p.m. in the Field House, University of West Florida.

Although no commitments will be sought or made at the occasion, the total of the advance pledges will be announced. The pledges include those from Deacons, Sunday School workers, Church Council, and staff.

Under the general direction of Max Dickson, banquet director, the entire evening will be one long to remember and it will mark a climax in the total "Second Mile" program.

This occasion will be a worship experience as we will be moving our Sunday evening service into a different setting this one time — from the sanctuary of First Baptist Church to the Field House at University of West Florida. Good food, Christian fellowship, and inspiration will be featured throughout the evening. The program will be brief and to the point.

### DID WE DO THE RIGHT THING?

In December, 1977, our church began construction of the New North Wing which includes an extension of the dining hall, the elevator, the music suite, the office area, and some additional educational space. The addition was to be financed by a Together We Build program, a three-year plan of over and above the budget contributions. Was it a wise step to take? *Most certainly, in every way.*

It was a wise step to take because of the space it has provided. For over two years we have enjoyed the beautiful facilities which the new wing provides.

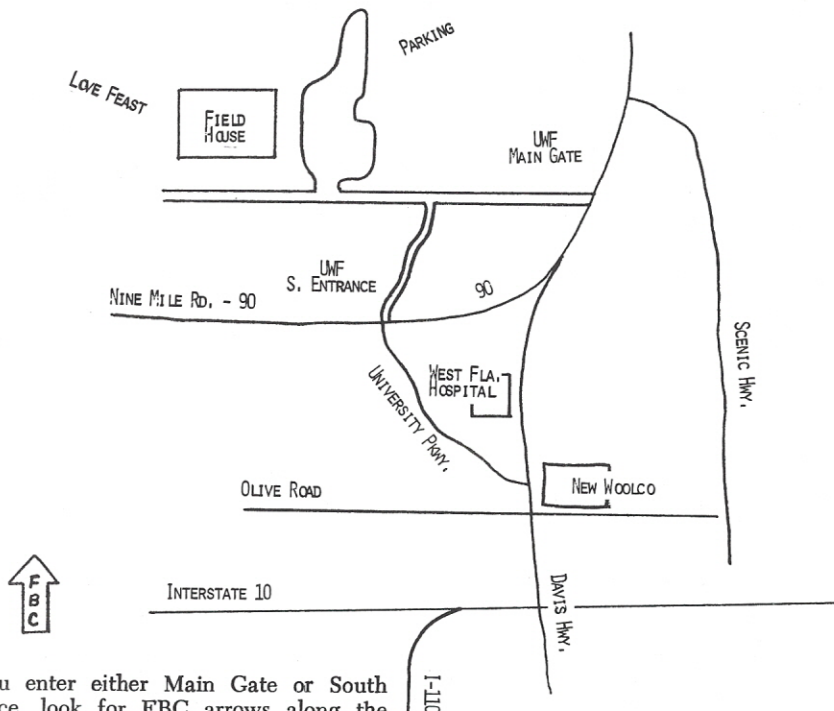
It was a wise step in that it has not affected our budget giving. Some feared that the Together We Build Program would take away from our budget giving. However, during the same time our people have given \$550,000 to the Together We Build Fund, the budget giving has increased each year, from total budget receipts in 1977 of \$712,000 to the projected \$900,000 in budget receipts for 1980.

It was a wise step because of the interest it has saved. To pay for the building in a four-year period, which our Together We Build and Second Mile offerings will allow us to do, instead of paying for it over a twenty year period out of budget gifts will save the church several hundred thousand dollars of interest.

It was a wise step because of the building costs it has saved. Building costs are rising approximately 10% each year. This means that if we waited until now to build the new addition, it would cost us 30% more than it did in 1977. In this one aspect alone, the step of faith which the church took in 1977 has saved us more than \$250,000.

As it was a wise step in 1977 to launch the Together We Build Program, so it is a wise step in 1981 to pay off the debt by going the Second Mile. Why? More about that next week. . . .
