Brian's Lines

Our meeting Sunday night after church officially inaugurated our major emphasis for the Spring, "To Pensacola With Love."

The *Motivation* is the Great Commission which Jesus left His church to go into all the world with the Gospel, beginning right here in our own Jerusalem (Acts 1:8). We are planning this major emphasis this Spring in obedience to His Command. This is our motivation.



The *Philosophy* is to concentrate the efforts of our people on this one month to get maximum results, and to involve as many of our people as we can. (Over 200 are now involved in our Task Forces.)

The *Purpose* is two-fold. Our primary purpose is to develop ministries for the month of March which will make a significant impact on our community. In addition, we are hoping that out of this month can come some continuing programs that will become a part of our permanent ministry to the city.

The *Organization* features task forces assigned to particular areas of interest. I selected the directors for each of these task forces. They in turn selected four or five to serve with them. Then I assigned the rest to the respective groups. Each of the twenty-five task forces will be analyzing and planning ministries in a particular area such as ministry to our schools, ministry to the economically underprivileged, etc.

The *Plan* is for the Task Forces to meet during the next six weeks and under the prayerful guidance of God, to determine the shape and content of our ministries during the month of March. I will meet with the Directors on February 4 (Wednesday night) and with the entire group on February 15 (Sunday night). These will be attempts to coordinate the effort. What happens during this month, however, will be determined by the Task Forces. Let's move forward with boldness and vision as we become Jesus' witnesses beginning here in our own Jerusalem.

MINISTER OF CHILDREN TO BE RECOMMENDED

The Personnel Committee is ready to present to our church a recommendation to call Mrs. Dorothy Walker as our Minister of Children. The recommendation will be considered by our deacons in a called meeting Wednesday, January 14. If approved by them, it will be presented to the church in a called meeting after church on Sunday night, January 18.

Dorothy has the combination of qualities that we have been looking for, experience, maturity, knowledge of Baptist work, dedication, and compassion for people.

She comes to us from a varied background in Children's work. During the years that her husband attended Southern Seminary, Dorothy taught second grade in Matthews, Kentucky. Then for eight years Dr. Walker served the Calvary Baptist Church, Florence, South Carolina, as pastor where Dorothy was vitally involved in the ministries there. In 1957 they felt led to the mission field and were appointed by the Foreign Mission Board to the Philippines. For eight years they served in the Philippines where Dorothy served as the head of the kindergarten and taught in local churches and public schools. Dr. Walker died in 1965 and Dorothy lived until '72 in Fort Valley, Georgia, where she taught first and second grades in public schools. The Georgia Baptist Convention asked her to join their staff in 1972 as G.A.'s and Mission Friends Director where she is currently serving.

If approved by the church, Dorothy will begin work with us the first of March.
