






## BUMPER STICKERS AVAILABLE



From the heart of the jungle to Family  
Night at First Baptist comes Walt Disney's  
beautifully animated film — “*The Jungle

In person, Annie Armstrong was a tall,  
dignified woman with forceful personality.  
That same personality flowed through a  
sharp pen. She and her sister, Alice, poured  
out endless pages of home missions infor-  
mation and motivation. First were leaflets—  
heart-rending stories about the struggles  
of frontier missionaries. Then were the  
columns for Baptist state papers, for Sun-  
day School publications, and for the home  
missions magazine. Then came forceful  
hand-written letters to a growing number  
of women's societies, personally inspiring  
them to good works in missions. After  
writing more than 1,000 letters in pro-  
motion of the first Christmas Offering for  
Foreign Missions, her hand was perma-  
nently damaged. Yet for 18 years she con-  
tinued to write. From her deathbed she  
sent a message to the annual meeting of  
Woman's Missionary Union. “Tell Them to  
Go Forward,” she said. Hoping to capture  
forever her commitment, and to share it  
with future generations, WMU gave the  
name of Annie Armstrong to the annual  
offering for home mission. This year, the  
Annie Armstrong Easter Offering has a goal  
of \$17,250,000 — more than half the funds  
needed for all the home missions work.
