**SUGGESTION FOR
"FAMILY NIGHT AT HOME"
MARCH:**

A Time For Beautiful Experiences

God has given us a marvelous world. In our family time we shall seek to discover various aspects of His creation.

Let us begin by looking through the eyes of Scripture at God's world. Read Psalm 104. Develop a list of things God has created. Share your discoveries. Let each family member then share his favorite part of God's creation.

Take a family nature walk. As you walk through your neighborhood or in the woods, discuss the different beautiful things. Pick up some small items which you consider beautiful: pebbles, snail shells, feathers, leaves, and flowers.

When the family returns home, work together to make a centerpiece of your treasures for the family table. (Prior to your walk you will need to find a base for this centerpiece.) As you develop the project, make sure each family member is allowed to contribute. Some of the members may want to arrange flowers while others work with wood; others may want to polish pebbles.

When the centerpiece is completed, pause for refreshments. A favorite family dessert should await each member (this dessert should be prepared before the family activity begins).

As the family enjoys the refreshments have a brainstorming session sharing ideas about ways to beautify the home, both inside and outside.

Conclude your family time with prayer. Ask one member of the family to thank God for your family, ask another to thank God for your home, and ask a third member to thank God for the times you have together. Then let Dad ask God to help the family grow stronger as everyone works together on the planned projects.
