



Registration Fee: \$11.00 per participant.


TENNIS TOURNAMENT — FRIDAY, JUNE 26, 7:00

A SUMMER READING CLUB

Readgatta Sailing Rules

1. Readgatta, a summer reading club for students who were in grades 1 - 8 this past school year, will begin June 21 and end August 2.
2. A Certificate of Recognition will be given to each person who completes the requirements for his/her grade level.

Special recognition will be given to the person in each group who reads the most books from the Church Library during the period of June 22 - August 2.

3. Requirements for a certificate will be:

GRADES 1 - 3:

Read six (6) books from the Children's Section in the Church Library.

GRADES 4 - 5:

Read six (6) books from the older children's section of the Church Library in the following classifications: 3 fiction books; 2 non-fiction books; 1 biography.

GRADES 6, 7, 8

Read six (6) books from the Church Library in the following classifications: 2 non-fiction; 1 biography; 3 fiction (C and CE books not acceptable).

4. Cards will be filled out and turned in for each book read when the book is returned to the Library.

As each participant joins, a boat with his/her name will be launched in the Readgatta and his/her weekly progress will be recorded.

5. All books must be checked out from the Church Library, and must be returned to the Church Library no later than Sunday, August 2.
