We have just returned from what I feel is the most positive Southern Baptist Convention in three years. Those who have been polarizing our convention have lost some favor, and we are moving back to the



middle road. Some of the issues that would have caused the most heated arguments were avoided. We reaffirmed the statement of our faith called the Baptist Faith and Message, and in doing so reconfirmed that the Southern Baptist Convention is not

to be an orthodoxy-measuring body but a mission support system for taking the good news of Jesus Christ to the world. The convention had a Florida flavor to it with Dr. Al Butler giving the response to the welcome to Los Angeles, and Dr. James Monroe of Ft. Walton Beach giving the convention sermon. I was proud of Allison Griffin as she served as a page at the convention. It was a good week, and it made me proud once again to be a Southern Baptist. The best part of all was being back home with you Sunday.


