Naval Training Command Choir to Sing Sunday Morning



The Naval Air Training Command Choir, based at Naval Air Station, Pensacola, Florida, is comprised of 32 young men of the Navy, Marine Corps, and Coast Guard who are training to become pilots and Naval Flight Officers. The unit, under the direction of Lt. John M. Harnish, Jr., is now in its thirty-third year of existence. Of the current group, less than half will be singing with the group six months from now. A rapid turnover, due primarily to members moving on to advanced programs of flight training, requires this group to maintain a skill uniquely its own.

Choir credits include performances before a joint session of Congress, at the Miss U.S.A. and Miss Universe Pageants, with the Atlanta Pops Orchestra, and numerous television appearances.

This will be her second annual concert at First Baptist Church, where she grew up and served as soloist in both the Youth and Adult Choirs.


The gospel concert this Sunday night contains selections from such composers as Clawson, Crouch, Terrell, Red, Bartlett and others.
