TPWL - PLUS . . . is a follow-up on our "To Pensacola With Love" program from last March. The focus will come in September as we crank things back up for the fall. As a part of our TPWL - PLUS program, we will continue the hospital and crisis ministries. Then we will also reenact seven other areas:

4. Family Clinic
5. Day of Love for Schools
6. Student Receptions at PJC and UWF
7. Television Spots

You will have an opportunity to be involved in the yard cleanup and home repair groups on Saturdays. The Nursing Home ministry will need your support as we touch the lives of these folks in a special way. The Day of Love for the schools will require your assistance in preparing goodies to take to all the schools. And the Family Clinic will be held on two Wednesday nights in September with special conferences that will be of interest to you. BOLD GIVING NOW . . .



MR. DON HAMRICK will present a concert of sacred music as a part of the evening service on Sunday, July 26.

Born in New Jersey, Mr. Hamrick was educated in the South, taking his degrees from Florida State University. He has been artist in residence at Georgia Southwestern University and Tennessee Tech University.

Mr. Hamrick graduated from Pensacola High School in 1968 and attended Pensacola Junior College before going to FSU. His mother, Mrs. Frances Hamrick, still makes her home in Gulf Breeze.
