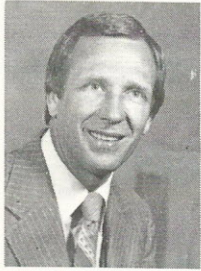

WORD ABOUT MY BOOK . . . There has been a delay at the publishers, I learned this week. My new book, *From Cover to Cover*, which was due to be out January 1, will be at the warehouse on March 7 and will probably be available in the stores by the first of April. I appreciate the interest so many of you have shown and am sorry for the delay. We will have them available here at the church around April 1.

For eleven years she has been filling this position at First Baptist Church, and she has done it with poise, punctuality, and professionalism. She is more than my secretary. GOOD WORDS ABOUT SUNDAY SCHOOL . . . continue to be appropriate. Despite the uncertain weather of January, our Sunday School continued to move forward. In January, 1981, we averaged 1217 per Sunday for the month. In January 1982, we averaged 1305 for the month. For the first four months of last year we averaged 1202 in Sunday School. For the first four months of this year we have averaged 1307. The key is the meeting and planning that is going on during the Wednesday night time. One of the teachers in the Young Adult Department told me they decided to experiment with the teacher's meetings this year, and now they would not do without it! That is a good testimony to the value of such meetings. Every department in the church needs to be involved in such planning. It is essential for the continued growth of our Sunday School.

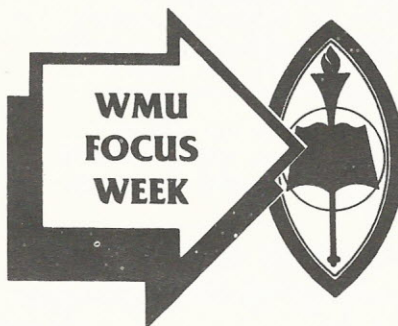
