


COOPERATIVE PROGRAM GIFTS . . .

The Christian Activities Center offers a variety of ministries for all ages. In the days ahead we hope to continue building on the foundation that has already been poured for this unique ministry. Many folks have asked me what ministries the Christian Activities Center provides. Listed are some specific areas.

"For you have been bought with a price; therefore glorify God in your body."

I Cor. 6:20

1. PERSONAL FITNESS — One part of total fitness is personal fitness. Every man and woman has been given a body by God to live in for the period in which they exist physically in space and time. We have a responsibility to take proper care of our bodies: to protect it, to give it the exercise it needs regularly and enthusiastically, and to keep it fit spiritually, psychologically, and physically. Through the programs offered by the CAC staff you can maintain and strengthen your personal fitness.
2. ARTS AND CRAFTS — The crafts program is a vital part of FBC recreation. We hope to expand this ministry to provide an opportunity for all ages to be creative and express themselves in a unique way.
3. SPORTS — The opportunities are great! We are looking to expand our sports program, not only in the church league but through intramurals and lifetime sports. We hope you will become a part of this very exciting ministry either as a player, coach, or spectator.
4. SOCIAL RECREATION — This is an opportunity to involve yourself with people, through a party, fellowship, or similar activity. The CAC is your resource center in helping Sunday School classes, departments, individuals, or any organization of the church with any activity.
5. SINGLE ADULTS — Single adults are special people at FBC and special programs will be offered to minister with singles through recreation.
6. OUTDOOR RECREATION — This ministry puts Christ at the center of the natural environment God has provided and uses nature to bring us closer to Him through camping, canoeing, back packing, fishing, skiing, and sailing.
7. PUPPETS AND DRAMA — These are tools that can express the Gospel in a unique way. The CAC will provide opportunities for those interested in expressing themselves in this manner.
8. RECREATIONAL GAMES — Games are fun and offer a good opportunity to meet people. The CAC has many games and we encourage you to take advantage of them.
9. FAMILY AFFAIRS — Because families are such a vital part of FBC one entire part of the CAC ministry is devoted to them, and we are exploring new ways of bringing families together. We hope you as a family will become involved in the opportunities offered by the CAC.
10. SPECIAL MINISTRIES — This ministry includes many seasonal activities and some that have been continually led by FBC; such as the Challenger Award Banquet, Founders Day Picnic, CAC Open House, etc.

These areas of ministry are stand-outs of the Christian Activities Center of First Baptist Church, Pensacola. A SERIOUS PLEA FOR "HELP!"

Extended Session (during the 11 o'clock worship service) is an extension of Sunday School for children from birth through four years of age. What happens during this time is very important to the children and to the 11 o'clock service.

We must maintain ten classes. This means 40 people a month (or 50 when a five-week month occurs) are needed to staff these classes, in addition to a paid worker in each. The program is for parents and depends upon parents taking their turn. We are grateful for those who are not parents who have taken turns.

We have enough volunteers to serve for a two-month schedule — each person serving one Sunday every two months. We would like to increase this to a three-month schedule. To help for one hour every three months is not a lot to ask!
