

## Brian's Lines

As we rapidly approach our revival, every member needs to be in a time of spiritual preparation. Let me make these suggestions:



1. Begin to pray daily for the revival effort.
2. Search your own life to see if there is anything there which will prevent God's using you as a channel for revival in our church and city. If so, take care of that now.
3. Be sure you have marked the dates, March 14-19, on your calendar and are planning to be at the services.
4. Invite someone to come with you to the Friends dinner on Monday night of the revival.
5. Begin asking your friends and neighbors to come.
6. Give this top priority.

Revivals come when God's people humble themselves, pray, turn from their wicked ways, and seek God's face. Will you help make it happen?

A MOVIE TO SEE . . . It is a thrill when a movie which has received public acclaim is also a movie which proclaims boldly and clearly a spiritual message. Such a movie is "Chariots of Fire." It is coming soon to Pensacola. Our support of such movies will insure more movies of this quality being produced in the future.

MESSENGERS TO THE SOUTHERN BAPTIST CONVENTION . . . June 15-17 will be the SBC meeting in New Orleans. Our church can have ten messengers. If you are interested, please call Mrs. Camp in the church office. We want to have our full slate of messengers this year.

GREAT FINANCIAL RESPONSE . . . so far in 1982. Thank you for your generosity and faithfulness. After six weeks in the new year, we are right on target with our budget giving. Mr. Santo tells me we are about 17% ahead of our last year's giving. Let's continue to build a strong financial base to carry out the ministry God has called us to in the heart of our great city.

In anticipation of the week of Revival (March 14 - 19), many church members are involved in preparation for various events and ministries of that very important week. Listed here are the committees, their chairmen, and their responsibilities.

**Singles** (Nancy Strebeck) — Plans are being made to invite and involve Singles in all revival activities, especially on Tuesday evening for the 5:45 p.m. supper preceding the service.

**Youth Night** (Jim Kersh) — This committee is making the detailed plans to have a large attendance of youth on Friday night for the evening revival service and a Youth supper at 5:45 p.m.

**Music** (Bob Hill) — A great crusade choir will rehearse in the auditorium each evening prior to the service, and the Music Committee for the revival is inviting additional singers to participate.

**Senior Adults** (Sarah Andress) — Besides generally encouraging attendance, this committee is planning a special Leisure Timers' Luncheon and service on Tuesday morning of the Revival week.

**Prayer** (Frances Aliberti) — This group has been active many weeks in prayer sessions and developing extensive plans to call the church to prayer during these days of Revival (including prayer request forms, prayer reminders, and testimonies).

**Publicity** (Don Smith) — Printed pieces, bumper stickers, radio and TV announcements, and newspaper stories and articles will be used to tell Pensacola about Revival.

**Hospitality** (Peaches Hosner) — A warm welcome, good fellowship, and good meals are being planned for our visiting Revival team.

**Usher** (Roger Yonker) — Our well-trained and fully staffed team of ushers will be on the job each evening during the Revival.

**Children** (Shirley Callaway) — The "Pastor's Pals" project now underway was the creation of this committee. Also, a special children's meeting and Hamburger Supper is planned for Sunday evening, March 14, beginning at 4:00 p.m.

**Blitz Day** (Ed Holt) — A "Blitz" type of door-to-door visitation is being planned to advertise the Revival and invite people to First Baptist Church.
