The time for the revival is drawing near, and last minute preparations are being made. Read the *Builder* carefully the next couple of weeks, for information will be given about the special emphases and what



you need to do to get in on them. Let me urge you to make the revival services a top priority for you. We have extended the services through Friday this year. We have two of the most gifted men I know of who will be coming to lead us. We

have saturated all of our plans and preparations in prayer. What happens now will depend on the faithfulness and concern of our people. The key will be our willingness to bring others to the revival services.

On Thursday night before the revival March 11, we will have an all church outreach night. Meet at the church at 6:30 for a meal and at 7:00 to go out.

On Monday night of the revival, March 15, we are having a special Friends dinner. We will begin serving the meal at 5:30. We want you to bring a guest who is not currently involved in church or who is not a Christian. Give them the opportunity to share the fellowship of a meal with us, and then to be a part of our revival services.

If you can't make the meal on Monday night, just bring friends and neighbors with you to the services each night. There are some who are hesitant about sharing their personal faith. But everyone can be involved in "bringatation", that is, bringing someone to church, praying for them, and then giving the Holy Spirit a chance to work in their lives. Will you commit yourself to pray for and support the revival? March 14-19 are the dates.

We have two ladies to thank for most of the banquet's success — Mrs. Virginia West, who directed the play, and Mrs. Patty Taylor, who directed all of the music.


