PRAYER COMMITMENT . . . On March 7, over 200 of you came forward in the evening worship service and committed yourself to pray ten minutes a day for ten weeks for the life and ministry of the church. He has just received the J. Nixon Daniel Memorial Scholarship at the seminary. As I read the letter and thought about the continued influence of Nixon Daniel, I realized how wonderful it is to invest in spiritual things because the dividends you reap are eternal.





CHILDREN AND SUMMER PROMOTION

On June 3rd school will be out! This is a "Hooray Time" for boys and girls — one of
the most exciting times in life. He / she has accomplished one more year of education and
is thrilled to be moving up to another grade. This makes each one feel bigger and more
important. We, as adults, want to rejoice with the children and affirm them in this accom-
plishment and excitement.

This is one very good, positive reason for Sunday School promotion to be the last of
June rather than waiting until October. We can capitalize on this excitement rather than
saying, "You must wait four more months before you are promoted in Sunday School." We
can now say, "We are proud of your growth and accomplishments in both public school
and Sunday School. We are happy to see you climb upward, one more rung on the ladder
of life."

Our Children's Division in church ends with the fifth grade because in public school
children begin middle school with the sixth grade. This is especially exciting to a fifth
grader and they want to move immediately into middle school at church. This is true also,
even more so, for the ninth graders entering high school. This is the major reason for
early promotion.

It will take some adjustment and flexibility but these are characteristics of good teachers —
which we have. Literature must be changed in several places to continue to use the last
quarter (J/A/S). This should be no problem as we anticipate this and plan ahead.

So, parents and teachers, shift gears now into "Forward, Early Promotion." It has been
said the seven last words of the church are, "We've never done it this way before." Let's be
willing to give it a try.
