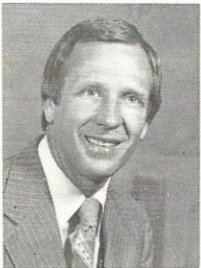

## Brian's Lines

Many of us can be described by a well known story about a donkey. Do you remember it? There was a certain donkey



who was standing between two stacks of hay. He wanted to be objective and scientific about his decision about which stack of hay he wanted to eat. Rather than giving up his objectivity and choosing one of the stacks of hay to eat, he remained

neutral, and starved to death between two stacks of hay!

There is a lesson here if we will see it. Life should not be lived in neutral. Somewhere along the line you need to make a decision about that which is important, and then commit yourself to it.

Commitment to something is a much needed virtue in our day. It has become chic to give the appearance of indifference and apathy. Neutrality has been elevated as a virtue, and like the donkey standing between two stacks of hay, we too are starving to death for the lack of a cause.

Billy Graham told of a young girl who married a radical revolutionary in Paris. Turning from her background, her faith, her parents, and her past, this girl connected her life to something which went against the whole grain of her training. When asked why she married the young man she answered, "He is the first person I have ever known who believes something enough to die for it. Although I don't believe exactly as he does, I was attracted to this man who had found a cause."

The world is hungry for people who will get out of neutral, take their stand squarely on one side or the other, and tell it like it is.

There is a deeper truth here. Not only should life not be lived in neutral. It cannot be lived in neutral. Whether consciously or not, every day you are making a choice, you are showing what is most important to you, by the life you live and the things you do and say.

So the question comes: What are you living for? What is your cause? Are you willing to give yourself to the cause of Christ? If so, come worship with us Sunday as we celebrate the resurrected Lord who gave us all a cause to live for.
