### *Brian's Lines*

We have just completed our best May since I came to be your pastor. We had more additions to the church this May than any other May in the last four years. From the figures below, you will notice that our Sunday School attendance continues to increase.

May 1980 — Avg. weekly attendance, 1214  
May 1981 — Avg. weekly attendance, 1235  
May 1982 — Avg. weekly attendance, 1284

We are averaging over 1300 in Sunday School for the year.

In addition, the financial picture is bright. Our giving in May 1982 (5 Sundays) was 23% higher than our giving in May 1981 (also 5 Sundays). We entered June last year \$35,000 behind our budget requirements. This year we enter the summer right on target. Our giving for the first five months of 1982 is 20% higher than the first five months of 1981. You are doing a remarkable job. May God bless you richly for your faithfulness.

Now is the time to build on this sensational spring and have an even more sensational summer. Let's keep giving, going, and growing for the glory of God.

COMMITMENT CHECKUP . . . We are twenty-one days (as of this writing) into our Fifty Days of Faithfulness. Are you following through on your five-fold commitment? If so, you are to be commended. If not, don't give up. Begin again today. Have you missed some days of praying and studying your Bible? Then, recommit yourself to this daily discipline now. Have you failed to put out of your life that burden you wanted to shed? Have you failed to add that new habit or pattern? Then start again today. Have you begun giving regularly to the church? Have you started giving God a tithe? If not, start today. Have you shared your faith with anyone yet? If not, stop right now and pray for someone. Then, ask God to give you an opportunity to share your faith with that individual. Then, when the opportunity comes, take advantage of it. What a thrill it will be if the Lord uses you to win somebody to His Kingdom. These Fifty Days of Faithfulness are special days. Keep up the good work.
