### SAMFORD UNIVERSITY HIGH SCHOOL DAY - BIRMINGHAM - OCTOBER 16

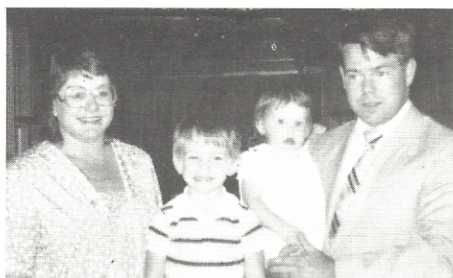
