

I felt the Spirit of God at work in our services all day on Sunday. The special





## TAYLORS IN CONCERT SUNDAY EVENING




will focus on the Tower of Babel. Sunday night we will move into the next section with the sermon, *"The Selection of Israel."* I'll see you here for another exciting day.




