

What a day we had Sunday! The attendance all day was outstanding. The music was heavenly. Mike had nearly 130 in the adult choir Sunday morning. The spirit of the services was inspiring. I hope you were here for a beautiful day.

AND WHAT A MONTH . . . I have not seen the final attendance figures for Sunday in Sunday School, but I believe that we will average 1400 in Sunday School during the five weeks in October. What is the secret of our tremendous growth in Sunday School over the last fifteen months? Several factors are key.

1. An excitement in the leadership.
2. An outreach mentality.
3. Well prepared lessons centered in God's Word.
4. Weekly planning meetings.
5. Strong fellowship.

We averaged 1239 in Sunday School in 1981. We have averaged 1306 in Sunday School in 1982. We're shooting for 1400 this year. Sunday School teachers and leaders — keep up the good work.

OUR CHURCH LETTER . . . was recently sent in, giving a report of our church life for 1981-82. During that time we had 233 new members join our church, bringing our total membership to 4195. We baptized 55 during the last twelve months. Our average Sunday School attendance was 1306. We have 526 enrolled in our church music programs. We have over 500 involved in our mission programs. Our offering to Home Missions was \$16,776. Our gift to the Lottie Moon offering for foreign missions was \$46,263. Total gifts received during this time was \$1,598,548. Of that we gave \$284,491 to mission causes. God has richly blessed our church during this last year, and we are thankful for all that He has done.



1412 Weekly Average for October

For the five Sundays in October our Sunday School averaged 1412, which is more than any other month in the history of First Baptist Church.

They fed over 200 at noon on Tuesday for the Ladies' Luncheon. On Wednesday night they fed over 600 for our regular Wednesday night meal. Thursday at noon they fed over 150 for our men's luncheon. Then, on Thursday night, they fed another 600 at our Great Challenge banquet. Add them up and you will find that over 1500 people were fed out of our church kitchen last week. It boggles my mind to think about it. What a tremendous job

these people do, and they certainly deserve a special thanks.
