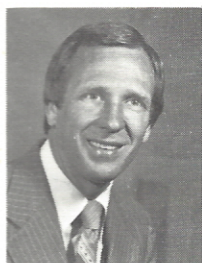

## Brian's Lines

I enjoyed our worship experiences Sunday although our attendance was down considerably. I especially enjoy hearing from our students in the annual Student Night at Christmas. Did you know that our college



ministry is expanding under the leadership of Bill Lee, who is the director? It is thrilling to me to be able to touch the lives of these college students at a pivotal time in their development. Their potential is amazing. Let's continue to support them

and pray for them so that their potential might be developed to its fullest for the Lord. Thanks, all of you who shared in the service Sunday night. We enjoyed it.

I PETER . . . is the January Bible Study book for this year. Each year, the Convention sets aside one book for a time of concentrated study during the month of January. I taught last year's book, Jeremiah, in a church-wide study on Sunday nights. I have decided not to do that again this year. Instead, I will be teaching I Peter in the Sanctuary Bible Class that I teach each Sunday morning at 9:30 in the Sanctuary. If you are not in Sunday School, why don't you come join us as we study, in depth, one of the most practical epistles of the New Testament. I'll begin with an introduction and background to I Peter this Sunday. I'll look for you here.

SPEAKING OF SUNDAY SCHOOL . . . we have experienced continued growth during this year. Last year we averaged 1306 in Sunday School for the year. Before Sunday (the first 12 weeks of the new Sunday School year), we were averaging 1400. Sunday's low attendance will drop our average down some, but the evident signs of growth are there. Let's continue to build our church around the teaching of the Bible in our Sunday School.

### SOMETHING NEW FOR THE LADIES!

. . . For two years, we have been providing a once-a-month ladies' luncheon. We will continue that this Spring, but we will change the time. I need you ladies to help us get the word out. PREACHING SCHEDULE . . . I have been planning my preaching schedule for the Spring and I thought you might like to know which direction we will be going. I have four more sermons in the series on "The Story of the Bible From Peak to Peak." These have to do with the church age. I will be preaching these during January. We will have some family sermons during the Spring: "The Pitfalls of Parenting" on January 16 when we have our parent-baby dedication service and "Steps to Marital Happiness" on February 6. We will have our Pastor's Pals again this year. It will be during April, and the four sermons will present some basic teachings of the church. I will preach "A Child's Eye View of God," "A Child's Eye View of Jesus," "A Child's

Eye View of Salvation" and "A Child's Eye View of the Church." During May I will preach a special series on the stages of life. Five sermons will be in this series: "Facing Childhood," "Facing Adolescence," "Facing Young Adulthood," "Facing the Mid-Life Crisis," and "Facing the Golden Years." On the remaining Sundays during the Spring I will complete a series on Acts that I began last year. I will pick up the series where I left off, in Acts 18.

THIS SUNDAY . . . We will begin 1983 with a sermon entitled, "A Call to Prayer." Sunday night I will preach "The Constitution of the Church" using Acts 1-2 as my text. I'll see you here as we begin our greatest year ever at First Baptist Church.
