

When Dr. Simoneaux returned last week from Japan, he stopped in Honolulu to visit with the missionaries at the Olivet Baptist Church to arrange for our choir's visit there on Sunday, July 17.

The Olivet Baptist Church is an English-speaking congregation, but has a large Japanese ministry. Our choir will sing in English and Japanese at the church.

We will have noonday services, "Self Starters" for the first through fifth grade children each night prior to the service, and special features for youth and singles after the services. THIS SUNDAY . . . I will pick up on the series of Acts that I preached last year. Sunday morning I will preach a sermon entitled, "Proclaiming the Gospel to a Secular World," using Acts 18:1-17. Sunday evening's sermon will use the text Acts 18:18. The title of the sermon will be "Commitment." I will see you here for another exciting day.

REPORT ON JAPAN SURVEY TRIP

After spending some 18-plus hours in the air, I finally landed in Osaka, Japan, at the International Airport. Missionary Tom Graham and his wife picked me up and we went to Kobe to check into the hotel. We first stopped at Kobe Baptist Church where the weekly Association Choir practices. After being greeted warmly by old friends and sharing with the choir our own vision, I checked into the Portopia Hotel.

The Lord opened up some wonderful opportunities of service for us. Besides singing at a number of churches, we have the very real possibility of singing for a nationwide T.V. audience, at the Kyoto Baptist Hospital (two concerts), a YMCA-sponsored city-wide appearance, a concert at the Hiroshima Peace Park, a city-wide ladies' evangelistic meeting in Hiroshima, a concert in the midst of the busiest train station in Osaka for thousands of people, plus the daily opportunities for witnessing that we will have as we go about our mission.


The Lord put me there at the same time as the yearly associational meeting and I saw all pastors in the area in one place. This saved me hours and hours of time. We will also be there at the same time as the anniversary celebration for Kyoto Baptist Hospital and will have a special place in the program.

On the way back, we will sing for two services at Olivet Baptist Church in Honolulu. (See front page). This unique and growing church has an English and Japanese Division and we will be singing and sharing testimonies in both services.

Pray daily for the mission and for Spirit-led preparation.
