FIRST QUARTER FINANCIAL REPORT

Budget Requirements	\$335,920
Given To Date	<u>\$273,083</u>



PRAYER FOR JAPAN PROJECT

A major prayer effort has begun for the Japan Mission Project. Mrs. Pat Overman has accepted the leadership for this prayer support project which will undergird the Japan Mission in its main objective, "that of sharing the gospel in word and song in the power of the Holy Spirit."

The prayer movement will include an entire week of prayer for the Japan Mission, which will begin on April 24th, and conclude on May 1st, Founder's Day, when we hope to subscribe the remainder of the financial support for the Mission Project. Prayer groups are being formed in the Sanctuary Choir and at each rehearsal the closing time is given over to prayer in small groups for the Mission. In addition, each Wednesday evening from 6:15 - 7:00 the old office is open for prayer by choir members and others for the Japan Mission.

In our own prayer time, please remember the following needs: Prayer for an open door for a concert at the Osaka Central Train Station; prayer for the Kobe YMCA as they try to organize a city-wide concert for us. Pray for an opportunity that seems to be opening for our choir to sing and share in a Buddhist Temple festival; pray for the request that came to us last week for an evangelistic meeting in Kyoto on July 14th; pray for the financial support needed.

FINANCES — This last week it was determined that after cookbook donations come in, the projected need for funds will come to approximately \$65,000, in addition to what has already been collected from choir members, special donations and designated offerings. This is quite a bit less than the \$100,000 need that was projected earlier in the year. Please continue to pray about how the Lord would have you share in the Japan Mission. Many have responded and continue to do so. Thank you for your vision.
