

SUNDAY SCHOOL CONTINUES TO PROSPER . . . at First Baptist Church. For the third time this church year we have averaged over 1400 for the month. The total for April will be about 1420. For the first time since I have been here, we did not have a big drop in attendance on Time Change Sunday. We have a fine balance in our Sunday School. Every area is strong. We are praying about the need for two Sunday Schools next year sometime so that we can provide space for our Adult Sunday School to grow. We have saturated our space for adults in Sunday School and feel that the two Sunday School approach will be more practical and economical than trying to build additional space at this time. Remember, every step of progress we take will necessitate change of some kind and inconvenience. We must be willing to take the step of faith, bear the inconvenience, and move forward together so that we can continue to grow.

LETCHER LAMKIN . . . received a letter from a family in Saudi Arabia who receive the tapes of our sermons here at First Baptist. In part, they said, "Here in this Moslem land where only the Koran can be read publicly, the message, the good news of our Savior, Christ our Lord, is heard, thanks to your ministry." 




