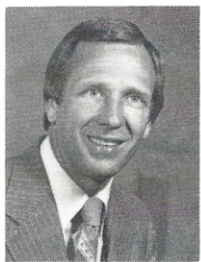

A NEW VENTURE IN PRAYER . . . was announced Sunday morning. For several years we have been thinking about and planning an Intercessory Prayer Ministry for our church. Dr. Bob Wilson, who is the chairman of one of the sub-committees on our Deacon Ministry Team which focuses on prayer, explained the program Sunday morning. Because of safety considerations, we believe that a prayer ministry which covers the hours 7 to 4 each day is the best place to begin. We are asking you to sign up for 30 minutes a week. 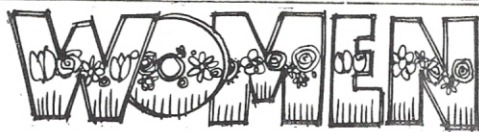
