## Brian's Lines

The first Sunday of summer, and what a tremendous start. I especially enjoyed the music of the day — the adult ensemble in the early service, Susan Christian in the late service, and the youth choir Sunday night. It was a strong beginning to what promises to be our best summer ever.



DOUBLE DAY . . . was great. I do not have, as I write this column, the report on Sunday School attendance or the offering. However, the worship services on Sunday morning were outstanding. Just on the basis of numbers, the decision to go to two morning worship services seems to be a good one. We had 140 singing in the two adult choirs. The most we have ever had in the adult choir on a Sunday morning up to this time is about 120. In the two morning worship services we had 170 more than our average worship attendance over the last six weeks, 100 more than we have had at any one worship service over the last six weeks. The jury is still out, but we have certainly made a good beginning. Thanks to all the choir members, to the sound people, and the ushers for their assistance in making a smooth transition to two morning worship services.

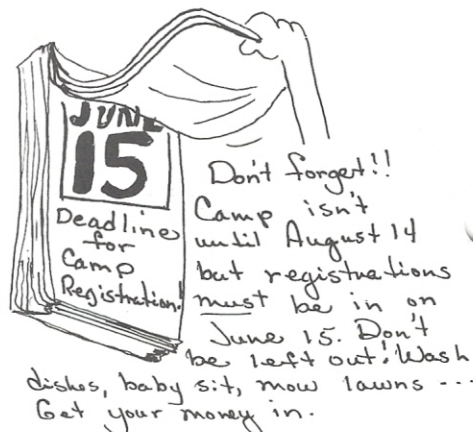
