VACATION BIBLE SCHOOL . . . was outstanding this year. I had the privilege of going around to each of the departments and sharing some time with the children. We had four groups of three year olds! It reminded me of how many young families are becoming involved in our church. A trip Sunday morning to the nursery confirmed it. The baby nursery was overflowing and they had to open another nursery! God is blessing us with so many children. Now we need to respond to His blessing by providing the leadership and workers that we need to minister to these children. Think about it. We need you to volunteer to come out of your adult Sunday School class and become a teacher in one of our children's departments. Call Dot Walker and talk with her about it.

SEVERAL IMPORTANT THINGS ARE HAPPENING RIGHT NOW . . . Our deacon selection committee under the leadership of Bob Gowing is ready to do their work. Gene Langston is the chairman of the Budget Planning Committee for 1984. They will begin their work in August. ## SERVICE PLAN FOR SUNDAY, JULY 3

The 8:30 A.M. Service will feature the Youth Choir and the Sermon Topic will be "*The Christian and Sex.*"

The 11:00 A.M. Service will be devoted to a program of Dedication and Prayer for the Mission Project.

I am convinced that neither those of us who go or the church as a whole will ever be the same. The money for the trip continues to come in. We have had to borrow in excess of \$25,000 (not the \$112,000 that we initially planned). Many of you can help by giving financially toward the trip. Others of you can support us with your prayers. This is a giant mission venture for the entire church — not just the choir. Let us pray that God will use it in a mighty way to accomplish His will.

THIS SUNDAY MORNING . . . we will have two different worship services. The

early service will be geared more toward our youth with a message entitled, "*The Christian and Sex.*" The youth choir will sing. Then, in the late service, we will be commissioning our missionaries as they leave for Japan. Our Japan choir will sing. You will hear testimonies, and then you will have an opportunity to become a prayer partner with someone who is going on the trip. It will be a deeply moving experience you will not want to miss. I would suggest that you attend both services Sunday. Sunday night we will have baptism and I will do my third sermon on Ecclesiastes. I'll see you here for another exciting day.







## PROCEDURE FOR NOMINATING DEACONS

The committee for the Nomination of Deacons requests that every member of the church suggest men who should be considered by the committee for nomination as deacons. You may suggest as many as you think qualify.

These suggestions must reach the committee before Wednesday, July 13. They may be given to any member of the committee, mailed to the church office in care of the committee or dropped in the offering plate. Suggestions are to be submitted only by members of the First Baptist Church, and therefore must be signed to be accepted.

Your committee, selected for the purpose of recommending to the church the best qualified persons, requests that you read the Scripture passages below and suggest the names of as many men as you believe to be qualified to serve as deacons. According to the policy of the church, inactive deacons will not be placed on the ballot unless suggested by one or more members of the church.

### SELECTION OF FIRST DEACONS

"And in those days, when the number of disciples was multiplied, there arose a murmuring of the Grecians against the Hebrews, because their widows were neglected in the daily ministrations. Then the twelve called the multitude of the disciples unto them, and said, 'It is not reason that we should leave the word of God, and serve tables. Wherefore, brethren, look ye out among you seven men of honest report, full of the Holy Ghost and wisdom, whom we may appoint over this business. But we will give ourselves continually to prayer, and to the ministry of the word.' " (Acts 6:1-4, KJV)

### THE CHARACTER AND QUALIFICATIONS OF ALL DEACONS

"Likewise must the deacons be grave, not double-tongued, not given to much wine, not greedy of filthy lucre; Holding the mystery of the faith in a pure conscience. And let these also first be proved; then let them use the office of a deacon, being found blameless. Even so must their wives be grave, not slanderers, sober, faithful in all things. Let the deacons be the husbands of one wife, ruling their children and their own houses well. For they that have used the office of a deacon well purchase to themselves a good degree, and great boldness in the faith which is in Christ Jesus." (I Timothy 3:8-13, KJV)

We urge you to be much in prayer that we as a church may know God's will in this all-important task.

The vote by the church membership on the nominations recommended by the committee will be announced later.


