

4. We have only begun to scratch the surface of what God wants to do in this place.





TO: Mississippi State Convention

There are so many things that stand out and are really special to me in just the short time I've been here in Bophuthatswana. I love my advisor and his family and we laugh and pray a lot together. My time spent at the MasterLife Workshop for the missionaries has blessed me to no end. But I think the thing that will always be special to me is the first Saturday evening I was here, Ed and I spent Friday and Saturday with the kids in Mogogelo and we'd gotten to be good friends in that time. It had gotten dark and I was outside. The kids all of a sudden just came up and swarmed me with questions. They could not believe a white American would come from "across the sea in the big plane" to tell them about Jesus. I shared with them, trying to hold back the tears, that I did love them and that the students of Mississippi loved them, too. They understood, too. They said, "Hey, I never knew that my God is your God." Wow, what a revelation that was to them. But I know they understand His love because we took the time to tell them. The questions began to come again. "How old are you?" "Do you have a girlfriend?" "Let me see your U.S. driver's license." They accepted me like a brother. Keep praying God will use me here and that He will raise up leaders among the Village People.
